"Behold Our God – Rediscovering the Attributes of the Almighty"

“Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom,
let not the mighty man boast in his might,
let not the rich man boast in his riches,
but let him who boasts boast in this,
that he understands and knows Me...”
— *Jeremiah 9:23–24*

“What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us.” (A.W. Tozer). This piercing insight is more than a pious quote—it’s a spiritual reality. Every belief we hold, every prayer we utter, every fear we face, and every hope we cherish is ultimately shaped by our view of God.

If our God is small, our worship will be small.
If our God is distant, our trust will be fragile.
If our God is unknowable, our love for Him will be cold.

But if our God is majestic, near, holy, sovereign, gracious, and true—our life will be transformed by the radiant light of who He truly is.

This series is not about theological trivia. It’s about awakening awe.

It’s about beholding the God who was not made in our image, but who made us in His.

It’s about moving beyond a God we’ve casually inherited or imagined—and returning to the God who actually is.

Why Study the Attributes of God?

1. **Because God is Worth Knowing for Who He Is.**

We were created to know God, not merely facts about Him. Theology is not the cold study of abstract concepts—it is the furnace where love and reverence are born. God has revealed Himself not as a vague cosmic force, but as the One who speaks, acts, loves, judges, and saves. Studying His attributes—His holiness, love, justice, mercy, omnipotence, omniscience, and more—is how we tune our hearts to His voice and fix our eyes on His beauty.

2. **Because Our Worship Can Never Rise Higher Than Our View of God**

What we believe about God determines how we worship Him. Low views of God produce shallow worship, man-centered preaching, and moralistic religion. But when we rediscover the majesty of God—when we grasp even a glimpse of His glory—worship becomes unavoidable. It ignites. It deepens. It consumes.

3. **Because Knowing God Changes Everything**

Struggling with anxiety? We need to know God’s sovereignty.
Feeling unloved? We need to know God’s steadfast love.

Feeling insignificant? We need to know God's omnipresence.

Every spiritual ailment has a theological remedy. God doesn't change, but everything else in our lives begins to change when we see Him rightly.

4. **Because Jesus is the Full Revelation of God**

Every attribute of God finds its fullest and most glorious expression in the person of Jesus Christ. He is not just the messenger of God—He is the image of the invisible God. To know the attributes of God is to know the heart of the Gospel. To understand God's justice is to grasp the cross. To understand His mercy is to hear Him say, "Neither do I condemn We." And "Well done, good and faithful servant."

The Journey Ahead

Over the coming weeks, we will walk through the glorious landscape of God's attributes—His incommunicable attributes (those that belong to Him alone: omniscience, omnipotence, eternality, immutability) and His communicable attributes (those He shares in measure with us: love, justice, mercy, goodness, faithfulness, and more). Each week will be an invitation to worship, a call to wonder, and a summons to deeper trust.

We were made to know Him.

We were created to reflect Him.

We were redeemed to glorify Him.

And We are invited now to behold Him.

Let us not settle for vague impressions of God when we can stand in the blazing light of His self-revelation in Scripture.

Let us not drink from broken cisterns when the Fountain of Living Waters has made Himself known.

Let us, with trembling joy and reverent delight, study the attributes of God—so that we might say with Moses:

"Show me Your glory."
